What is the Plenary Pals program?



Implemented by the New Investigator and Trainee Section, the Plenary Pals program will help first-timers navigate the meeting agendas, network, and more.

When is this program available?

This program is available at the Annual Scientific Meeting and the Scottsdale Headache Symposium.


I'm a first-timer and want to be paired with a guide, how do I sign up?

Sign-up is available during the registration process for the relevant meeting. During registration, if you are interested in participating in this program as a first-time attendee, please select the "First Time Attendee" box. Following this selection, please select the "I'd like to be paired with a Plenary Pal" option.



I'm interested in becoming a mentor/guide for this program, how do I sign up?

Sign-up is available during the registration process for the relevant meeting. During registration, if you are interested in becoming a mentor for this program, you will select the "Yes, I would like to be a Plenary Pal/Guide" option. Please note, this option should only be selected if you are *not* a first-time attendee.



How often do Plenary Pals meet?

Plenary Pals typically connect via phone or video chat once or twice prior to the conference. Then during, we encourage you to set up time to meet early on. Often, these connections last much longer than the course of a meeting and is a great way to network and form professional relationships with colleagues in the Headache community.

The best part of this program is that many former first-time attendees go onto become Plenary Pal Guides at future meetings!
